



Second Collection: Through your participation in tonight's Second Collection, you show that you stand in solidarity with our Muslim siblings to oppose Islamophobia and white supremacy, as most recently manifested through the targeted massacres at the Al Noor Mosque and the Linwood Islamic Center in Christchurch, New Zealand. In order to support our Muslim neighbors here in Boston, tonight's Second Collection will benefit The Islamic Society of Boston Cultural Center (ISBCC), a mosque and community center serving over 1500 congregants at its weekly Friday services. The vision of the center is "to build a community of leaders rooted in the Islamic tradition, committed to American ideals and empowered to serve the common good." In addition to its dedication to living the ideals of the Quran and the life of the Prophet Mohammed, ISBCC's core values include: "preserving the diversity of the Boston community," "being open and welcoming," "serving humanity, loving our neighbors," "nurturing and strengthening the youth," and "championing and supporting the marginalized and underserved." If you write a check, please make it payable to "Dignity/Boston". We will then write one larger check to The Islamic Society of Boston Culture Center.

Breakfast Items Needed: Dignity/Boston will be serving breakfast to our community after our Easter Vigil Service.
